## Ministry Spotlight:

# Our church members' ministry to the community



Richmond FUMC has a rich history of supporting our community. Each ministry's work sustains both those who give and those who receive. Let's celebrate just some of the ways our congregation has reached out over the past year.



**Kentucky Army National Guard:** Men's Ministry distributed \$1,500 in gift cards to families of deployed service members.

**Sharing Ministry:** 306 families in need received a total \$14,360.

**Madison Home:** More than 1,300 lunches were made and delivered

**Community Meals:** Another 1,500 hot meals were served throughout the week.

**Kentucky United Methodist Children's Home:** Quilts were provided for incoming children, financial contributions exceeded \$1,500, and numerous gift cards were given to purchase both Christmas presents and necessities.

**Aldersgate Camp:** More than \$8,000 was given to help to rebuild the Lodge.

**Flood Buckets:** Cleaning supplies and over \$1,000 was given to aid those recovering from devastating floods in Eastern Kentucky.

**Food Deliveries:** Our team delivered weekly to more than 70 households with elderly and disabled people who were unable to pick up commodities from God's Outreach.

**Wesley Foundation:** Dedicated cooks provided Tuesday evening meals to Eastern Kentucky University students before worship services.

**Financial Scholarships:** Five EKU students received a total \$10,000 to support their education.

**Methodist Mountain Mission:** Truckloads of clothing and supplies were donated to support Eastern Kentuckians in need.

**Operation Christmas Child:** More than 75 shoeboxes will be shipped around the world.

**Henderson Settlement:** Our youth joined the District Youth Mission Week helping with clean-up efforts. United Women in Faith donated holiday supplies for low income families and led a retreat for women of the Central Appalachian Missionary District.

**Vacation Bible School:** Over 30 volunteers ministered to children from our church and the community.

**Fall Festival:** A large crowd of families including children and grandparents were welcomed in to celebrate the season.



# Pastor's New Year Message



Beloved Church Family,

Happy New Year! As we turn the calendar page and look ahead, our hearts are fresh with anticipation for what God has in store for us. It's a time for resolutions, a time for new beginnings, and a time to re-anchor ourselves in the enduring mission Christ has given us. This year, our vision is clear: we are called to be a people who are "Making Disciples Who Make a Difference."



This vision is not just a catchy phrase; it is rooted deeply in the climax of Matthew's Gospel, what we call the Great Commission: "And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'" (Matthew 28:18-20, ESV) Jesus has given us both the mission and the promise of His presence to ensure its success. The Magi were seekers: They journeyed from the East, following a star, seeking the newborn King. They had an *Epiphany*. They recognized Jesus not just as a local king, but as the Savior for all people—a revelation for the entire world. After worshiping Jesus and offering their gifts, they returned to their home country by a different road. Their encounter with Christ changed them and sent them back into the world as witnesses to the light they had seen.

This is our story, too. We have seen the light of Christ and had our own *Epiphanies*. Now, empowered by His authority and guided by His Spirit, we are called to GO. We are to be the modern-day Magi, carrying the light of Christ to a world often walking in darkness.

Our 2025 Theme "**We Are Part of It**" emphasizes that the Great Commission is for every believer, not just a select few. Each of us has a role in this grand mission. **Going:** We don't have to travel across the globe, though some of us will! Going means stepping out of our comfort zones—sharing the Gospel with someone at the grocery store, inviting a neighbor to church, or mentoring a new believer. **Baptizing & Teaching:** Discipleship is more than making converts; it's about making mature followers of Jesus. It means walking alongside others, teaching them to observe all that Jesus commanded, and integrating them into the life of the church. **Making a Difference:** A true disciple of Jesus lives a life that reflects His character, making a tangible difference in their community and the world.

This year, let's move beyond being mere church members and embrace the fullness of being disciples. Let's commit to pouring into one another, building spiritual giants who, in turn, pour into others. My prayer for us is that by this time next year, we can look back and see a wave of ripple effects—new believers brought to faith, new leaders raised up, and our community transformed because we chose to be disciples who make a difference.
