Ash Wednesday: A Fresh Start

We embark on this 40-day journey with Ash Wednesday. It may seem somber, marked by the call to “return to the Lord with all your heart.” When we receive the ashes, we are reminded of our mortality: “Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”

However, this is not a message of despair. It is a revelation and a honest reflection on our lives, inviting us to stop hiding and let go of distractions. We turn away from what breaks our hearts and God’s heart. This “do-over” leads to a deeper and more authentic life.

Finding Identity in the Dust: “ We are Part of it”

Lent is often perceived as a time of giving things up, but it is more accurately understood as a time of self-discovery. In the midst of the hustle and bustle, we often forget our true identity as beloved children of God. In our fasting, quiet reflection, and introspection, we are stripped down to the essentials. As you navigate the desert of Lent, remember that you are an integral part of it. You are part of the story of redemption. You are part of a community walking together. You are part of a broken, loved, and hopeful creation waiting to bloom.

There is Hope for Spring

Just as the crocus pushes through the cold earth, Lent prepares our hearts for the joy of Easter, the springtime of the soul. The ashes on our foreheads, shaped like a cross, symbolize that even in our brokenness, we are marked by hope. As we look to the new life of spring, let us walk together with intentionality. Let us take a long, loving look at our lives and allow God to reshape our hearts.
